




Presidential Suite —

The majestic building on Aspazijas bulvāris 22 has welcomed the most prominent city guests since the 19th century. It was in 1878 that it first opened its doors as a hotel, the most modern accommodation in Riga that combined the best Western and local traditions. Bearing the name of the picturesque European capital, Hotel Rome was founded by the famous Latvian architect and philanthropist Kristaps Morbergs. It soon acquired the reputation of an excellent weekend stay among travellers and a fascinating locale in the eyes of Rigans.

Hotel Rome was the first hotel in Riga that had a telephone and electric light. This was achieved by establishing a small power station next to the Opera House, which had already been crowned as a significant landmark at that time. In the 1920s, the hotel changed its proprietors and was further managed by the Jurgenson family – a team of highly skilled hoteliers. It was during that era that Hotel Rome became famous for its enticing restaurant, called the Roman Cave. Not only the exquisite cuisine but also the mazelike room layout attracted more and more visitors as years went by.

Each guest could find a room that would perfectly suit their particular taste. History lovers preferred the Room of Knights, diplomats tended to settle down in the Dutch Hall, young couples - in the Hall of Love, while gourmands chose the Hunting Hall as their favourite location. The restaurant's menu was based on a similar blend of international and local foods just like today, and the fruit and vegetables delivered fresh from the Jurgensons' own farm made each dish particularly natural and exclusive. Nonetheless, the real pearl of the "Roman Cave" was the Porcelain Room, which normally functioned as a storage room for a grand selection of golden plates and silverware and was opened for guests only on special occasions - for instance, when the legendary Russian opera singer Feodor Chaliapin visited the city.

At the dawn of WWII, there were several other celebrities who enjoyed the hospitality of Hotel Rome. One of them was the famous Russian writer Ivan Bunin, who resided in the hotel five years after he had won the Nobel Prize in 1938. The acclaimed guest was impressed by the Europeanism of the beautiful capital city and the great service he received. Zog I, King of the Albanians, was also supposed to take refuge in Hotel Rome following the Italian occupation of Albania in 1939. However, due to the then unpleasant association of Rome with the Fascist army, the King chose Hotel Saint Petersburg, located in front of Riga Castle, instead.



Despite the never-ending conflicts between the construction team and the project manager, the renowned pre-war architect Sergey Antonov, Hotel Riga was soon ready to welcome the most refined guests again.

The unique ambience of the hotel owes much to the high-calibre staff, whose outstanding skills and resourcefulness were often highlighted in biographical novels.

Even today, four years after the change of ownership and another reconstruction period, The newly designed hotel was considered to provide one of the best services in the Soviet Union. In 1967, it made history as the first place in Latvia that had a bar, while its head bartender Jāzeps Arbidāns, became a legend for mixing the first-ever alcoholic cocktail not only in Riga, but also in the whole of the Soviet Union.

Sadly, the tourist-favourite hotel did not manage to escape the nightmare of WWII. After being almost entirely destroyed in a projectile attack, Hotel Rome was quickly rebuilt in the following years, and along with a new face, the building also got a new name - this time proudly representing its birthplace, Riga.

the people-oriented management style is still written in the hotel's DNA.

The European luxury, combined with a downto-earth attitude and openness to new ideas, as well as to objective criticism, is what will separate Grand Hotel Kempinski Riga from any other hotel in the capital.
